Greetings, Brooke,

Here are the key points from my productive meeting with INAC and WLWB in Yellowknife on 28 June. (I'll .pdf this note and send to Jean for filing, when I get to Iqaluit). -- ssp

Meeting with Indian and Northern Affairs (INAC) Inspectors and Wekeezhii Land and Water Board (WLWB) Staff - 1430h, 28 June 2010

Present: Clint Ambrose and Nahum Lee, INAC inspectors, and from the WLWB, Mark Cliff-Phillips, executive director, and Brett Wheler, regulatory specialist, and ssp.

Purposes: (1) discuss new DO-27 land-use permit(s) to replace #M2004C0044 (camp + exploration) and #M2004C0045 (winter route to connect camp to main winter road); (2) personal contact with regulators (always best practice and encouraged by the regulators).

Key Points:

- Extending the two permits is not allowed by the legislation, but the renewal of these permits can be straightforward, if the permits are kept as-is, *i.e.*, keep same activities as already permitted. Indicate in the Project Description that the DO-27 project is on care and maintenance, but might require drilling and other renewed activities in future.
- Discussion ensued as to whether the two permits should be rolled into one. This would depend whether Peregrine would keep the <49 people which is in force for the camp permit. If so, consider combining. If not, or unsure, keep the route permit, as there is provision in it for extra people housed in a road camp.
- WLWB does not issue Class B licences, so any new application would be for a Class A (as at present).
- Can avoid water licence if maintain <100m3 per day which currently is in force for the existing permits.
- A Final Plan still is required for the two existing permits at expiry, even though activity continues.
- Always good to file application early, even though permits do not expire until December 2011. Ssp suggested that work on new application would proceed during slow period for Peregrine, likely in upcoming Christmas/early winter. That is OK with regulators. Always allow 4-6 months, in any event, particularly as review by communities is slow (they are understaffed, and an exploration level permit is not priority for them).
- No translations of documents required, although some community groups may request.
- No special consultation required with departments and agencies, as no change in activities is proposed.
- Include an Engagement Plan in the application. Emphasise to groups, when contacting them, that meetings would be scheduled at key trigger points, such as when there is a change, *i.e.*, when renewed activity is planned. WLWB: Correspondence likely will suffice with those groups until then, as they have to prioritise their time.

- Groups to consult: (1) Tlicho; (2) North Slave Metis Alliance (NSMA); (3) Akaitcho implementation office (contact there is Steve Ellis from Lutsel K'e, who is known to ssp and Peregrine). No need to contact Akaitcho first nations separately: Akaitcho office will direct.
- Summarise remediation work in the application or Project Description: WLWB feels this would be a positive sign to Aboriginal groups.
- INAC and WLWB pleased with Peregrine's level of commitment and behaviour; they are happy to work with us.
