Hi Shirley,

Yes, I recall we did discuss whether or not it would make sense to combine the two existing permits.

I suggest that combining the two permits would result in a more clear and concise description of Peregrine's activities. Reviewers may have a better understanding and the review process might be simplified if all activities are combined under a single permit application. The application itself, engagement and consultation, processing, etc will likely be more efficient with a single permit application.

Be sure to clearly reference the existing permits and the fact that the new application is an amalgamation of activities that have already been permitted. Making a clear linkage between the new and existing permits demonstrates that the activities were previously screened and need not be re-screened (unless activities will be different under the new permit).

Thank you for your letter of 20 August and attached photos; I am awaiting the promised photos from the removal of the old fuels by pilot Dave Crerar, which should follow soon (a transmission glitch in our receiving them).

As per our meeting of 28 June 2010, Peregrine will begin to prepare a new application or applications for #MV2004C0044 (a permit for exploration and a camp on the DO-27 property in the Lac de Gras area) and #MV2004C0045 (the associated permit for a winter-access route which connects to DO-27 Lake at the exploration camp), with the objective of no change to current status. I welcome your input, and that of Mark and Brett in terms of whether it would be most expeditious to leave the two existing permits as-is, in terms of coverage, or to combine all activities into a single new permit. I know that we discussed this topic, and welcome your input as to the best approach.
