

**CONDITIONS ANNEXED TO AND FORMING PART  
OF LAND USE PERMIT NUMBER W2009X0002**

**Part A: Scope of Permit**

1. This permit entitles Indian and Northern Affairs (CARD) to conduct the following activities:
  - a) Conduct remedial work at the North Inca Minesite, including dismantling existing infrastructure, removal of waste items from site, and road decommissioning as described in the approved Remedial Action Plan (RAP).

All activities are to take place within:

Minimum Latitude N64 15.807 Maximum Longitude W115 13.601

Maximum Latitude N64 16.400 Minimum Longitude W115 12.827

2. The Permit is issued subject to the conditions contained herein with respect to the use of land for the activities and area identified in Part A, Item 1 of this permit.
3. Compliance with the terms and conditions of this permit does not absolve the Permittee from responsibility for compliance with the requirements of all applicable Federal, Territorial and Municipal legislation.

**Part B: Definitions**

“**Act**” means the *Mackenzie Valley Resource Management Act*;

“**Board**” means the Mackenzie Valley Land and Water Board established under Part 4 of the *Mackenzie Valley Resource Management Act*;

“**Inspector**” means an Inspector designated by the Minister under the *Mackenzie Valley Resource Management Act*;

“**Sump**” means a man-made pit, trench hollow or cavity in the earth's surface used for the purpose of depositing waste material therein;

**Part C: Conditions Applying to All Activities (the headings correspond to Subsection 26 of the Mackenzie Valley Land Use Regulations)**

**26(1)(a) LOCATION AND AREA**

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| 1. | The Permittee shall not conduct this land use operation on any lands not designated in the accepted application unless otherwise authorized in writing by an Inspector. | PLANS |
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**26(1)(b) TIME**

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| 2. | The Permittee's Field Supervisor shall contact an Inspector at (867) 669-2794 at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to the commencement of this land use operation.  | CONTACT INSPECTOR      |
| 3. | The Permittee shall advise an Inspector at least ten (10) days prior to the completion of the land use operation of (a) the plan for removal or storage of equipment and materials, and (b) when final clean-up and restoration of the land used will be completed.  | REPORTS BEFORE REMOVAL |
| 4. | The Permittee shall provide in writing to the Inspector, at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to commencement of this land use operation, the following information:<br>(a) person, or persons, in charge of the field operation;<br>(b) alternates; and<br>(c) all methods for contacting the above person(s). | IDENTIFY AGENT         |

**26(1)(c) TYPE AND SIZE OF EQUIPMENT**

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| 5. | The Permittee shall not use any equipment except of the type that is listed in the accepted application unless otherwise authorized in writing by an Inspector. | ONLY APPROVED EQUIPMENT |
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**26(1)(d) METHODS AND TECHNIQUES**

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| 6. | The Permittee shall not conduct vehicle travel in areas without snow-covered surfaces.  | VEHICLE TRAVEL        |
| 7. | The Permittee shall construct and maintain winter roads with a minimum of ten (10) centimetres packed snow at all times during this land use operation. If this cannot be done, then the Permittee shall construct <u>Ice Roads</u> in a manner authorized by an Inspector. | SNOW ROADS/ ICE ROADS |

**26(1)(e) TYPE, LOCATION, CAPACITY AND OPERATION OF ALL FACILITIES**

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| 8. | The Permittee shall not locate any sump within one hundred (100) metres of the ordinary high water mark of any water body, unless otherwise authorized in writing by an Inspector. | SUMPS FROM WATER |
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9. The Permittee shall ensure that the land use area is kept clean at all times. CLEAN WORK AREA

**26(1)(f) CONTROL OR PREVENTION OF PONDING OF WATER, FLOODING, EROSION, SLIDES AND SUBSIDENCE OF LAND**

10. The Permittee shall prepare the site in such a manner as to prevent rutting of the ground surface. PREVENTION OF RUTTING

11. The Permittee shall suspend overland travel of equipment or vehicles at the first sign of rutting. SUSPEND OVERLAND TRAVEL

**26(1)(g) USE, STORAGE, HANDLING AND ULTIMATE DISPOSAL OF ANY CHEMICAL OR TOXIC MATERIAL**

12. The Permittee shall not use chemicals in connection with the land use operation that were not identified in the accepted application. APPROVAL OF CHEMICALS

13. The Permittee shall dispose of all toxic or persistent substances in a manner as described in the accepted application. WASTE CHEMICAL DISPOSAL

14. The Permittee shall dispose of all combustible waste petroleum products by incineration or removal. WASTE PETROLEUM DISPOSAL

15. The Permittee shall report all spills immediately to the 24 hour Spill Report Line (867) 920-8130, which is in accordance with instructions contained in "Spill Report" form N.W.T. 1752/0593. REPORT CHEMICAL AND PETROLEUM SPILLS

**26(1)(h) WILDLIFE AND FISHERIES HABITAT**

16. The Permittee shall construct and maintain the water intake with an adequate screening device to prevent entrainment of fish. PREVENT ENTRAINMENT

**26(1)(i) STORAGE, HANDLING AND DISPOSAL OF REFUSE OR SEWAGE**

17. The Permittee shall dispose of all sewage and grey water as proposed in the accepted application. SEWAGE DISPOSAL

18. The Permittee shall burn all combustible garbage and debris, except plastics, daily, in a container acceptable to an Inspector. INCINERATION

19. The Permittee shall remove all scrap metal, discarded machinery, parts, barrels kegs, plastics, and building materials as specified in the accepted application. REMOVE WASTE MATERIAL

**26(1)(j) PROTECTION OF HISTORICAL, ARCHAEOLOGICAL AND BURIAL SITES**

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| 20. | The Permittee shall not conduct a land use operation within 30 m of a known monument or a known or suspected historical, archaeological site or burial ground.   | OPERATE<br>VEHICLE |
| 21. | The Permittee shall immediately suspend operations should a suspected historical, archaeological site or burial ground be discovered and notify the Mackenzie Valley Land and Water Board at (867)669-0506 or an Inspector at (867)669-2794. | CONTACTS           |

**26(1)(m) FUEL STORAGE**

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| 22. | The Permittee shall not place any fuel storage containers within one hundred (100) metres of the normal high water mark of any water body, unless otherwise authorized in writing by an Inspector. | FUEL BY<br>STREAM   |
| 23. | The Permittee shall seal all container outlets except the outlet currently in use.   | SEAL OUTLET         |
| 24. | The Permittee shall not allow petroleum products to spread to surrounding lands or into water bodies.  | FUEL<br>CONTAINMENT |
| 25. | The Permittee shall mark all fuel containers, including 45-gallon drums, with the Permittee's name.  | MARK<br>CONTAINERS  |
| 26. | The Permittee shall ensure that adequate contingency plans and spill kits are in place, prior to commencement of operations, to respond to any potential spills.                                   | SPILL<br>RESPONSE   |

**26(1)(n) METHODS AND TECHNIQUES FOR DEBRIS AND BRUSH DISPOSAL**

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| 27. | The Permittee shall dispose of all brush and debris cleared from trails and lines by:<br>(a) pushing or felling the material into the adjacent forest;<br>and<br>(b) cutting the branches from the stems, and cutting the stems into lengths so that all parts of the trees felled lie flat on the ground surface. | BRUSH<br>DISPOSAL       |
| 28. | The Permittee shall totally dispose of all debris and brush by burning.  | BURN BRUSH              |
| 29. | The Permittee shall progressively complete disposal of all debris and brush.   | PROGRESSIVE<br>DISPOSAL |

**26(1)(o) RESTORATION OF THE LANDS**

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| 30. | The Permittee shall complete all clean-up and restoration of the | CLEAN-UP |
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lands used prior to the expiry date of this Permit.

31. The Permittee shall backfill and restore all sumps prior to the expiry date of this Permit.
