1.0	26 (1) (a) - LOCATION AND AREA OF LANDS	
1.1	The Permittee shall not conduct this land use operation on any lands not designated in the accepted application, unless otherwise authorized in writing by the BOARD .	PLANS
1.2	The Permittee shall not conduct any part of the land use operation within three hundred (300) metres of any privately owned land or structure, unless otherwise authorized in writing by the BOARD .	PRIVATE PROPERTY
1.3	The Permittee shall excavate and stockpile in areas designated in an approved GWICH'IN TRIBAL COUNCIL pit development plan or as authorized by a GWICH'IN LANDS OFFICER and/or LAND USE INSPECTOR	DESIGNATED AREAS
1.4	The Permittee shall remove from Territorial Lands, all scrap metal, discarded machinery and parts, barrels and kegs, buildings and building material.	REMOVE WASTE MATERIAL
2.0	26 (1) (b) - TIMES OF THE LAND USE OPERATION	
2.1	This permit expires five (5) years from the date of issuance or when the Permittee is NOT in possession of a valid access authorization from GWICH'IN TRIBAL COUNCIL	EXPIRY DATE
2.1	This permit is valid when used in conjunction with the associated GWICHIN TRIBAL COUNCIL Authorization, held by the Permittee	VALID AUTHORIZATION
2.2	The Permittee's Field Supervisor shall contact or meet with the Staff and Inspectors at the office of the Gwich'in Land and Water Board, telephone number (867) 777-4954, at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to the commencement of this land use operation.	CONTACT GLWB STAFF/ INSPECTORS
2.3	The Permittee shall advise a LAND USE INSPECTOR at least ten (10) days prior to the completion of the land use operation of (a) his plan for removal or storage of equipment and materials, and (b) when final clean-up and restoration of the land used will be completed.	REPORTS BEFORE REMOVAL
2.4	The BOARD reserves the right to impose closure of any area to the Permittee in periods when dangers to natural resources are severe.	CLOSURE
2.5	The Permittee shall complete all clean-up and restoration of the lands used prior to the expiry date of this Permit.	CLEAN-UP

3.0 26 (1) (c) - TYPE AND SIZE OF EQUIPMENT

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| 3.1 | The Permittee shall not use any equipment except of the type, size, and number that is listed in the accepted application, unless otherwise authorized in writing by a LAND USE INSPECTOR . | ONLY APPROVED EQUIPMENT |
| 3.2 | The Permittee shall keep all garbage and debris in a covered metal container until disposed of. This container shall be marked with the Permittee's name | GARBAGE CONTAINER |

4.0 26 (1) (d) - METHODS AND TECHNIQUES

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| 4.1 | The Permittee shall not use explosives. | RESTRICTIONS |
| 4.2 | Stripping of overburden must be approved by a LAND USE INSPECTOR prior to commencement of the quarrying operation. | STRIPPING OF OVERBURDEN |
| 4.3 | The Permittee shall slope the sides of excavations and embankments except in solid rock to two (2) horizontal to one (1) vertical, unless otherwise authorized in writing by a LAND USE INSPECTOR . | EXCAVATIONS AND EMBANKMENTS |
| 4.4 | The Permittee shall slope the sides of waste material piles to a gradient specified in writing by a LAND USE INSPECTOR . | WASTE MATERIAL |

5.0 26 (1) (e) - TYPE, LOCATION, CAPACITY AND OPERATION OF FACILITIES

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| 5.1 | The Permittee shall ensure that the land use area is kept clean and tidy at all times. | CLEAN WORK AREA |

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| 6.1 | The Permittee shall remove any obstruction to natural drainage caused by any part of this land use operation. | NATURAL DRAINAGE |
| 6.2 | The Permittee shall install erosion control structures as the land use operation progresses, unless otherwise authorized by a LAND USE INSPECTOR . | EROSION CONTROL |
| 6.3 | The Permittee shall prepare the site in such a manner as to prevent rutting of the ground surface. | PREVENTION OF RUTTING |
| 6.4 | The Permittee shall save the organic soil stripped from the excavation area. | SAVE ORGANIC SOIL |
