1.0 26 (1) (A) - LOCATION AND AREA

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| 1.1 | The Permittee shall not conduct this land use operation on any lands not designated in the accepted application, unless otherwise authorized in writing by the Board. | PLANS |
| 1.2 | The Permittee shall not conduct any part of the land use operation within 300 metres of any privately owned land or structure unless otherwise authorized in writing by the Board. | PRIVATE

| 1.7 | The Permittee shall use existing campsite. | CAMP

| 1.9 | The Permittee shall at all times conform to all applicable Federal, Territorial or local regulations, ordinances or bylaws. | CONFORM TO

2.0 26 (1) (B) - TIME

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| 2.1 | The Permittee's Field Supervisor shall contact or meet with a Land Use Inspector at the Inuvik office of the Department of Indian Affairs and Northern Development, Phone Number (867-777-3361), at least 48 hours prior to the commencement of this land use operation. | CONTACT

| 2.2 | The Permittee shall advise a Land Use Inspector at least 10 days prior to the completion of the land use operation of (a) his plan for removal or storage of equipment and materials, and (b) when final clean-up and restoration of the lands used will be completed. | REPORTS

| 2.9 | The Board for the purpose of this operation designates <u>April 15</u> , as spring break-up. | SPRING
BREAK-UP |

2.11 The Permittee shall remove all snow fills from stream crossings prior to spring break-up or completion of the land use operation unless otherwise approved in writing by a Land Use Inspector. REMOVE SNOW FILLS

2.15 The Board reserves the right to impose closure of any area to the Permittee in periods when dangers to natural resources are severe. CLOSURE

3.0 26 (1) (C) - EQUIPMENT

3.1 The Permittee shall not use any equipment except of the type, size, and number that is listed in the accepted application, unless otherwise authorized in writing by the Land Use Inspector. ONLY APPROVED EQUIPMENT

3.2 The Permittee shall equip bulldozer blades used in this operation with "mushroom" type shoes or a similar type of device which shall be extended 20 centimetres below the cutting edge of the blade. BULLDOZER BLADES & SHOES

4.0 26 (1) (D) - METHODS AND TECHNIQUES

4.2 The Permittee shall construct and maintain winter roads with a minimum of fifteen (15) centimetres packed snow at all times during this land use operation. If this cannot be done, then the Permittee shall construct Ice Roads in a manner approved by a Land Use Inspector. SNOW ROADS/ ICE ROADS

4.11 The Permittee shall leave a strip of undisturbed vegetation at least 30 metres in width between clearing and public roads or navigable waterways. TREE SCREEN

4.13 The Permittee shall not erect camps or store material on the surface ice of streams or any other waterbodies unless authorized in writing by an Inspector. STORAGE ON ICE

5.0 26(1)E) - TYPE, LOCATION, CAPACITY AND/OPERATION OF FACILITIES

5.7 The Permittee shall ensure that the land use area is kept clean and tidy at all times. CLEAN WORK AREA

6.0 26 (1) (F) - CONTROL OR PREVENTION OF FLOODING, EROSION AND SUBSIDENCE OF LAND

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| 6.2 | The Permittee shall remove any obstruction to natural drainage caused by any part of this land use operation. | NATURAL

| 6.7 | The Permittee shall not use the bed of streams for access routes except for the purpose of crossing the streams unless otherwise authorized by a Land Use Inspector. | STREAM

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| 7.1 | The Permittee shall not use chemicals in connection with the land use operation without the prior approval of the Board. | APPROVAL

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| 8.1 | The Permittee shall not unnecessarily damage wildlife habitat in conducting this land use operation. | HABITAT

| 8.12 | The Permittee shall not in any circumstances deposit or allow the deposit of any deleterious substances (including but not limited to fuels, lubricants, hydraulics, and coolants) of any type into any waters, or in any place under any conditions where the deleterious substances may enter any waters. | DEPOSITING

9.0 26 (1) (I) -STORAGE, HANDLING AND DISPOSAL OF REFUSE OR SEWAGE

- 9.6 The Permittee shall keep all garbage and debris in a covered metal container until disposed of. **GARBAGE CONTAINERS**
- 9.12 The Permittee shall remove all garbage and debris from the land use area to a disposal site approved in writing by a Land Use Inspector. **REMOVE GARBAGE**

10.0 26 (1) (J) - HISTORICAL / ARCHAEOLOGICAL SITES

- 10.1 The permittee shall not operate any vehicle within five hundred(500) metres of a known or suspected archaeological site. **VEHICLE OPERATION**
- 10.2 The Permittee shall not remove, disturb or displace any archaeological specimen or site. **DISTURB OR DISPLACE**
- 10.3 The Permittee shall contact the Board and the PWNHC should an archaeological site or specimen be encountered by any land use activity **CONTACTS**
- 10.4 The permittee shall immediately cease any activity that disturbs an archaeological or historical site, encountered during the course of a land use operation; until permitted to proceed with the authorization of the Board. **STOP LAND USE ACTIVITY**

11.0 26 (1) (K) - OBJECTS AND PLACES OF RECREATIONAL, SCENIC AND ECOLOGICAL VALUE

- 11.4 The Permittee shall not feed wildlife. **NO FEEDING WILDLIFE**

12.0 26 (1) (L) - SECURITY DEPOSIT

13.0 26 (1) (M) - PETROLEUM FUEL STORAGE

- 13.2 The Permittee shall not place any petroleum fuel storage containers within thirty (30) metres of the normal high water mark of any **FUEL BY STREAM**

stream.

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| 13.4 | The Permittee shall not allow petroleum products to spread to surrounding lands or into water bodies. | FUEL

| 13.16 | The Permittee shall mark all fuel containers with the Permittee's name. This includes 45 gallon drums. | MARK

14.0	26 (1) (N) - DEBRIS AND BRUSH DISPOSAL
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| 14.2 | The Permittee shall make the windrow of brush and debris lie flat and compact by:

(a) bucking the material into suitable lengths and lopping the branches from the stem, and/or

(b) crushing with heavy machinery in order to compact the material. | BRUSH

| 14.15 | The Permittee shall not leave tree stumps exceeding 20 centimetres above the ground surface. | TREE

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| 15.2 | The Permittee shall complete all clean-up and restoration of the lands used prior to the expiry date of this permit. | CLEAN-UP |
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16.0	26 (1) (P) - <u>Permits</u>
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| 16.2 | The Permittee shall keep on hand, at all times during this land use operation, a copy of the Land Use Permit. | COPY OF PERMIT |
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17.0	31 (1) (Q) - MATTERS NOT INCONSISTENT WITH THE REGULATIONS
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17.2 The Permittee shall not construct approaches abutted to any public highway or road, without prior approval of the Department of Public Works and Highways, Government of the Northwest Territories.

17.5 The Permittee shall, while conducting the operation, make every effort to avoid covering or destroying traps or snares that may be found in the area.

17.6 The Permittee shall restore any trails used by trappers or hunters by slashing any and all trees that may fall across these paths or trails and by removing any other obstructions such as snow piles or debris that may be pushed across the trails.
