PART C: CONDITIONS OF LAND USE PERMIT

1.0 26 (1) (a) – LOCATION AND AREA

1.1 The Permittee shall not conduct this land use operation on any PLANS
lands not designated in the accepted application, unless otherwise
authorized in writing by the Gwich'in Land and Water Board.

2.0 26 (1) (b) – TIME

2.1 The Permittee shall provide to the Land Use Inspector, in writing, IDENTIFY
at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to the commencement of this AGENT
land use operation, the following:

(a) the person, or persons, in charge of the field operation to
whom notices, orders, and reports may be served;

(b) alternates; and

(c) all methods for contacting the above person(s).

2.2 The Land Use Inspector reserves the right to impose closure of any CLOSURE
area to the Permittee during periods when dangers to natural
resources are severe.

3.0 26 (1) (c) – TYPE AND SIZE OF EQUIPMENT

3.1 The Permittee shall only use equipment designated in the accepted APPROVED
application, unless otherwise authorized in writing by a Land Use EQUIPMENT
Inspector.

4.0 26 (1) (d) – METHODS AND TECHNIQUES

- 5.0 26 (1) (e) –TYPE, LOCATION, CAPACITY AND OPERATION OF FACILITIES**
- 5.1 The Permittee shall ensure that the land use area is kept clean and tidy at all times. CLEAN WORK AREA
- 5.2 The Permittee shall adhere to all mitigation measures in the accepted application. MITIGATION MEASURES
- 6.0 26 (1) (f) – CONTROL OR PREVENT PONDING, FLOODING, EROSION, SLIDES AND SUBSIDENCE OF LAND**
- 6.1 The Permittee shall remove any obstruction to any natural drainage caused by any part of this land use operation. NATURAL DRAINAGE
- 7.0 26 (1) (g) – USE, STORAGE, HANDLING AND ULTIMATE DISPOSAL OF CHEMICAL OR TOXIC MATERIAL**
- 7.1 The Permittee shall dispose of all combustible waste petroleum products by removal. WASTE PETROLEUM DISPOSAL
- 7.2 The Permittee shall immediately report all spills to the 24 Hour Spill Report Line (867-920-8130) in accordance with instructions contained in the NWT SPILL REPORT form NWT1752/0202. REPORT SPILLS
- 8.0 26 (1) (h) – PROTECTION OF WILDLIFE AND FISHERIES HABITAT**
- 8.1 The Permittee shall not feed wildlife. NO FEEDING WILDLIFE
- 8.2 This land use operation is in an area where bears may be encountered. Proper food handling and garbage disposal procedures will lessen the likelihood of bears being attracted to your operation. Information about the latest bear detection and deterrent techniques can be obtained from Environment and Natural Resources in Inuvik at 867-777-7308. BEAR/MAN CONFLICT
- 9.0 26 (1) (i) – STORAGE, HANDLING AND DISPOSAL OF REFUSE OR SEWAGE**
- 9.1 The Permittee shall dispose of all sewage and grey water as proposed in the accepted application. SEWAGE DISPOSAL
- 9.2 The Permittee shall keep all garbage and debris in a covered metal container on site until disposed of as proposed in the accepted application. GARBAGE CONTAINER
- 9.3 The Permittee shall remove from all lands used in this land use operation, all scrap metal, discarded machinery and parts, barrels and kegs, buildings and building material and deposit as specified in the accepted application, or as authorized in writing by a Land Use Inspector. REMOVE DEPOSIT WASTE MATERIAL

| 13.3 | The Permittee shall seal all container outlets except the outlet currently in use. | SEAL OUTLET |
| 13.4 | The Permittee shall mark all fuel containers with the Permittee's name. This includes forty-five (45) gallon drums. | MARK CONTAINERS |

| 17.2 | The Permittee shall take water samples downstream from the James Creek Highway Camp twice per year; once in September and once in May. These samples will be analyzed for Polyaromatic Hydrocarbons and oil and grease. The results will be submitted to the Land Use Inspector and the Gwich'in Land and Water Board no later than six (6) weeks after the samples are taken. | WATER SAMPLES |
