Subject to the Mackenzie Valley Resource Management Act and the Mackenzie Valley Land Use Regulations, the Gwich'in Land and Water Board (hereinafter referred to as the Board) hereby grants authority to:

To proceed with the land use operation described in the application of:

Commencement Date: June 1st, 2006

CONDITIONS ANNEXED TO AND FORMING PART OF LAND USE PERMIT

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1.0 26 (1) (a) - LOCATION AND AREA

- 1.1 The Permittee shall not conduct this land use operation on any lands not designated in the accepted application, unless otherwise authorized in writing by the Board. PLANS
- 1.2 The Permittee shall not conduct any part of the land use operation within three hundred (300) metres of any privately owned land or structure, unless otherwise authorized in writing by the Board. PRIVATE PROPERTY
- 1.3 The permittee shall locate all camps on gravel, sand or other durable ground CAMP LOCATION
- 1.4 The Permittee shall at all times conform to all applicable Federal, Territorial or local regulations, ordinances or bylaws CONFORM TO APPLICABLE LAWS
- 1.5 The Permittee shall not construct an adit or drill site within 30 metres of the normal high water mark of a stream unless approval in writing is obtained from the Board. LOCATION OF ADITS & DRILL SITES

2.0 26 (1) (b) - TIME

- 2.1 The Permittee's Field Supervisor shall contact or meet with a Land Use Inspector at the office of the Department of Indian Affairs and Northern Development, telephone number (867) 777-3361, at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to the commencement of this land use operation. CONTACT INSPECTOR
- 2.2 The Permittee shall advise a Land Use Inspector at least ten (10) days prior to the completion of the land use operation of (a) his plan for removal or storage of equipment and materials, and (b) when final clean-up and restoration of the land used will be completed. REPORTS BEFORE REMOVAL
- 2.3 The Permittee shall submit a progress report to the Board and Land Use Inspector every _10_days during this land use operation. PROGRESS
- 2.4 The Permittee shall complete all clean-up and restoration of the lands used prior to the expiry date of this Permit. CLEAN-UP
- 2.5 The Board reserves the right to impose closure of any area to the Permittee in periods when dangers to natural resources are severe. CLOSURE

3.0 26 (1) (c) - EQUIPMENT

- 3.1 The Permittee shall not use any equipment except of the type, size, and number that is listed in the accepted application, unless otherwise authorized in writing by a Land Use Inspector. ONLY APPROVED EQUIPMENT
- 3.2 The Permittee shall remove from all lands all scrap metal, discarded machinery and parts, barrels and kegs, buildings and building materials. REMOVE WASTE MATERIAL

4.0 26 (1) (d) - METHODS AND TECHNIQUES

- 4.1 The Permittee shall adhere to all mitigation measures accepted in the land use application MITIGATION
- 4.2 The Permittee shall plug all bore holes as the land use operation progresses. PLUG HOLES

5.0 26 (1) (e) - TYPE, LOCATION, CAPACITY, AND OPERATION OF FACILITIES

- 5.1 The Permittee shall not locate any sump within thirty (30) metres of the normal high water mark of any stream. SUMPS FROM WATER
- 5.2 The Permittee shall ensure that the land use area is kept clean and tidy at all times. CLEAN WORK AREA

6.0 26 (1) (f) - CONTROL OR PREVENTION OF FLOODING, EROSION AND SUBSIDENCE OF LAND

- 6.1 (a) The Permittee shall, where flowing water from bore holes is encountered, plug the bore hole in such a manner as to permanently prevent any further outflow of water. PLUG ARTESIAN WELLS

(b) The artesian occurrence shall be reported to the Board within forty-eight (48) hours.
- 6.2 The Permittee shall screen all water intakes from fish bearing waters to exclude fish in accordance with DFO requirements. NEW WATER SCREENS

7.0 26 (1) (g) - USE, STORAGE, HANDLING AND DISPOSAL OF CHEMICAL OR TOXIC MATERIAL

- 7.1 The Permittee shall not use chemicals in connection with the land use operation without the prior approval of the Gwich'in Land and Water Board. APPROVAL OF CHEMICALS
- 7.2 The Permittee shall report all spills immediately in accordance with instructions contained in "Spill Report" form NWT 1086. 24 hour spill report line (867)920-8130. REPORT CHEMICAL AND PETROLEUM SPILLS

8.0 26 (1) (h) - WILDLIFE AND FISHERIES HABITAT

- 8.1 The Permittee shall not unnecessarily damage wildlife habitat in conducting this land use operation. HABITAT DAMAGE
- 8.2 Your operation is in an area where bears may be encountered. BEAR/MAN

8.3	The Permittee shall not feed wildlife.	NO FEEDING WILDLIFE
9.0	26 (1) (k) - OBJECTS AND PLACES OF RECREATIONAL, SCENIC AND ECOLOGICAL VALUE	
9.1	The Permittee shall immediately cease any activity that disturbs an archaeological or historic site encountered during the course of the land use operation until permitted to proceed with the authorization of the Gwich'in Land and Water Board.	STOP LAND USE ACTIVITY
9.2	The Permittee shall contact the Gwich'in Land and Water Board and the Prince of Wales Northern Heritage Centre should an archaeological site or specimen be encountered by any land use activity	CONTACTS
9.3	The Permittee shall not remove, disturb or displace any archaeological specimen or site.	DISPLACE OR DISTURB
9.4	The Permittee shall burn all combustible garbage and debris in a container acceptable to a Land Use Inspector.	INCINERATION
9.5	The Permittee shall remove all garbage and debris from the area of the land use operation to a disposal site approved in writing by a Land Use Inspector.	REMOVE GARBAGE
11.0	26 (1) (m) - PETROLEUM FUEL STORAGE	
11.1	The Permittee shall not allow petroleum products to spread to surrounding lands or into water bodies.	FUEL CONTAINMENT
11.2	The Permittee shall not place any petroleum fuel storage containers within thirty (30) metres of the normal high water mark of any stream.	FUEL BY STREAM
11.3	The Permittee shall at all times have on site sufficient spill clean-up equipment and material in readiness to clean-up all hazardous material which may be spilled.	OIL SPILL CLEAN-UP EQUIPMENT
13.0	26 (1) (q) - MATTERS NOT INCONSISTENT WITH THE REGULATIONS	
13.1	The Permittee shall display a copy of this permit in a conspicuous place each campsite established to carry out this land use operation.	DISPLAY in PERMIT
13.2	The Permittee shall provide in writing to the Inspector, at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to commencement of this land use operation, the following information: (a) person, or persons, in charge of the field operation to whom notices, orders, and reports may be served; (b) alternates; (c) all the indirect methods for contacting the above person(s).	IDENTIFY AGENT
