We received your letter dated February 9<sup>th</sup> today. I am emailing, you rather than calling, as Clint Ambrose indicated that email was the best way to get in touch with you these days.

We agree that there have been delays in the processing of your applications, and we would like to take you up on your suggestion to meet so that we can discuss these applications further.

As we understand it, we have two applications on hold from Bathurst Inlet Developments at this time. According to our records, MV2009J0029 currently sits with INAC awaiting a determination on consultation as a result of a section 35 of the *Constitution Act* assertion from the Yellowknives Dene First Nation. The second application, MV2009X0028 is currently classified as incomplete awaiting additional information from Bathurst Inlet Developments.

Dear Sir;

In response to your letter of July 30<sup>th</sup> please see below.

- 1) As mentioned in the application when this permit was initially granted we followed all required consultation requirements. Unfortunately I do not have copies of this (perhaps DIAND does). As the camp also has a valid Tourism License, once again the effected groups would have been consulted with by the GNWT as it is part of the requirement for the license prior to being granted.

Specifically in this case all groups mentioned in your letter were sent a faxed copy of this application several weeks prior to our submission to MVLWB (copies of the transmission report were provided in the application).

The only group to respond was the YDFN; I am waiting to hear if they would like a meeting and or presentation.

I trust this will suffice as the "community involvement log" as requested.

- 2) Spill response plan (please see attached)
- 3) The camp is already in existence and is used to accommodate clients and staff. It consists of one 12 X 20 dry (mounted on a wheeled trailer) one 14 X 16 kitchen, one 16 X 24 accommodation building, one outhouse and one 14 X 30 warehouse. Other equipment is one diesel (12 kw) generator and necessary equipment to support the camp. Water consumption is less then 200 gals per day. Water is drawn from Sandy Lake.

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Other equipment on site is, 4 boats / motors, two canoe and all related camp supplies to run the camp.

Water used is less then 100 gals / day.

Thank you and I trust this is the information needed to complete our application.
